Coquitlam Telehandler Training Courses - Employers are responsible for making sure that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work proficiently making use of telehandler equipment. The skill level of workers should be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers have to provide training so that employees obtain the needed level of skill. The level of responsibility of the person needs to be taken into account when training is provided. Effective training would solve whatever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training could be undertaken by engaging the services of an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine whether or not the learning goals have been met.

Local, federal and state/provincial regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator training and testing. Basic training does not address such subject matters as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, utilizing various attachments, or the operation of rotating machines. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

Like whichever machine, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The machine inevitably would suffer wear eventually. Correct maintenance is vital to ensuring safe use of the telehandler machinery. Inspections and checks are essential to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators have to have machine-specific training to be able to prevent, rectify and monitor problems associated with deterioration, damage and wear. Employees require competence and experience in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be viewed seriously and followed, taking into consideration such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machinery along with the owner of the equipment share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is normally carried out by the telehandler owner whereas pre-use inspections are typically done by the user.
