Coquitlam Forklift License - Within North America, getting a forklift license or forklift certification involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over certification, training and license for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators may acquire a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements need to be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks which come together with various alternatives, such as sit-down and stand-up. There are different types and sizes of forklift suitable for various industrial uses. Operator training programs are usually individualized to be able deal with the specific types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift inside a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck within a shipyard. The various forklifts and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machinery and businesses. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to focus on particular course requirements but instead on the results of individual training programs.

On the job training that is offered by the employer is the most common way of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who provides this method of certification is needed to offer classroom sessions and practical training on machinery at their place of work. Employers could opt to train staff on every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The course incorporates lift truck operation procedures, company regulations, forklift maintenance and safety measures. Subject matters specific to the worksite, such as hazardous conditions or materials, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize each and every type of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually requires an on-site component with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a lift truck for that specific employer only.

The most important factor of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements vary from one kind of machine to another. Safety problems vary from employer to employer, and from industry to industry. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training might have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, such as in marine and offshore uses.
